





research focusing on the basic concepts of tea culture, tourism and tourism development.


Slow development stage (2010-2015)


research focusing on tourism products, teatourism integration and tea-tourism interaction.

The life satisfaction of local farmers and *Fenghuang Dancong Tea* are closely related to each other in a symbiotic and coprosperous relationship.

Driving factors for migrant workers return include economic interests, job changes, family events, hometown tea events, and personal emotions;

Returning migrant workers mainly and easily have teacentered agricultural employment at their hometown;

Returning migrant workers usually face difficulties in terms of land, capital, equipment, labor, and management;

Returning migrant workers are highly satisfied with the decision to return and their current living conditions.
